One of the oldest and most successful rock bands in history, The Rolling Stones, took the stage in front of 50,000 people at HaYarkon Park in Tel Aviv on June 4 .

It was the Stones' first concert in Israel.

Their appearance made a bold statement to those musicians and others who have chosen to attempt to boycott and isolate Israel by refusing to perform in the Promised Land.

Despite the Boycott, Divestment and Sanctions (BDS) movement against Israel, many modern musicians and performers have made their way to this tiny country in the Middle East to perform (few of Israel's neighbors would allow most modern performers-including those who support the BDS movement- to appear.

Miley Cyrus appearing in Saudi Arabia?-I think not!).

As a matter of fact, Israel is a magnet for high profile stars:

In the last few years, Paul McCartney, Alicia Keys, Elton John, Madonna, Lady Gaga, Bob Dylan, Justin Bieber, the Red Hot Chili Peppers, Leonard Cohen, Guns N' Roses, Aerosmith, Cyndi Lauper, Rihanna and dozens of other headliners have appeared in Tel Aviv. This summer Justin Timberlake, Soundgarden, The Pixies, Neil Young, Paul Anka, Prodigy and Boy George are scheduled, along with the Stones.

Last year in June, Barbra Streisand did a concert for 16,000 in Israel.

Mick Jagger, the Stones singer and leader, sent a Tweet message upon leaving Israel.

"Thanks to everyone in Israel for the wonderful reception,"

Jagger tweeted in Hebrew.

"It was a great concert and we will always remember it."

President's Corner



My fellow congregants,
