Zodiac Symbols & the Jewish Months

It is widely accepted that the zodiac signs as we know them originated in ancient Mesopotamia. The Greeks later adopted the symbols from the Babylonians and passed them on to other ancient civilizations such as the Romans, who came much later.

If the Jews received the zodiac signs from another culture, it was from the Babylonians (now Iraq).

The Zohar, the main work of the Kabbalah (Jewish mysticism) correlates the 12 signs of the zodiac to the 12 Hebrew months and the 12 tribes of Israel:

Nisan is Aries/Ram corresponding to Judah and the faculty of Speech.

Iyar is Taurus/Bull corresponding to Issachar (Torah scholars) and the faculty of Thought.

Sivan is Gemini/Twins corresponding to Zevulun (Torah supporters) and the faculty of Motion.

Tamuz is Cancer/Crab corresponding to Reuven (meaning "see") and the faculty of Sight.

Av is Leo/Lion corresponding to Shimon (means "hear") and the faculty of Hearing.

Elul is Virgo/Virgin corresponding to Gad and the faculty of Action.

Tishrei is Libra/Scales corresponding to Ephraim (fruitful) and the faculty of Marital Relations.

Cheshvan is Scorpio/Scorpion corresponding to Menashe and the faculty of Smell.

Kislev is Sagittarius/Archer corresponding to Benjamin (warriors) and the faculty of Sleep.

Tevet is Capricorn/Goat corresponding to Dan (judge) and the faculty of Anger.

Shevat is Aquarius/Water Drawer corresponding to Asher (wealth) and the faculty of Taste.

Adar is Pisces/Fish corresponding to Naftali and the faculty of Laughter.

The expression "Mazel Tov" actually means "May your constellations be good". In other words: May the stars be aligned correctly so that you have good luck.

The zodiac and Judaism have a long relationship.

THE CITIZENSHIP TEST


Saul Epstein was taking an oral exam in his English as a Second Language class. He was asked to spell "cultivate," and he spelled it correctly.
