It saddens me to report that our temple building was vandalized on the evening of October 3d. The glass above the entry door was shattered, the building façade facing Acoma Blvd and our street sign were damaged. A passer by reported seeing a shirtless man throwing rocks at the building. The police responded but were unable to locate the suspect. I have been in touch with the Lake Havasu PD and there is a police report on file, Our insurance company was contacted and a claim filed. Estimated received from contractors put the damages at almost \$2000, the majority of that being the glass replacement. Rudy Glass is moving forward on the glass replacement, the other work will take place once that is complete. It is sad that such things happen at all, but it only takes one misguided individual.
