The joyous Festival of Simchat Torah will be celebrated at Temple Beth Sholom, Thursday, Oct. 16 Services start at 7:30 pm.

Simchat Torah ("Rejoicing in the Torah") is the last Jewish holiday of the Fall Holiday Season and (aside from Shabbat) the last holiday until Chanukah.

Simchat Torah gives the Jewish people everywhere on earth the opportunity to perform a "do over".

After reading the weekly parsha (Torah portion) every Shabbat all year long, the Jewish people finish the final portion on Simchat Torah and start all over again from the beginning (Including TBS's Torah Study Class, second and fourth Saturday of each month at 10 am).

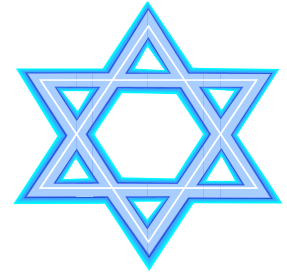
